



Outdoor Curtains Cleaning Guide

INTRODUCTION: Outdoor curtains made from Sunbrella®, Tempotest®, Duracord®, and BellaDura® fabric are not only beautiful additions to your outdoor space but are also highly durable and resistant to stains, however even the most durable fabrics can still get dirty! This cleaning guide is designed to help you maintain the pristine condition of your Outdoor Curtains purchased on OutdoorCurtains.com. It covers how to clean spills, stains, and deal with dirt/mold/mildew accumulation. Please note that these curtains cannot be machine washed.

General Care and Maintenance:

1. Regular Cleaning:

- Brush off loose dirt, dust, and debris from your curtains regularly to prevent staining and prolong the fabric's life.
- This can be done using a non-abrasive brush or a canned air spray.

2. Machine Washing (Not Recommended):

- These curtains should not be machine washed or put into a washing machine.

Spot Cleaning:

1. Common Stains:

For common stains like coffee, wine, or ketchup:

- Blot the stain with a clean cloth or paper towel.
- Mix mild soap and lukewarm water and gently scrub the stained area with a soft brush or sponge.
- Rinse thoroughly and allow it to air dry.

2. Mold and Mildew:

- Create a solution of one part bleach and four parts water (for Sunbrella®).
- Test this solution on an inconspicuous area first.
- Gently scrub the affected area with the bleach solution.
- Rinse thoroughly with water and air dry.
- For Tempotest®, Duracord® and BellaDura® fabrics, use a mildew-resistant cleaner suitable for outdoor fabrics.

Stain Removal:

1. Stubborn Stains:

- For persistent stains, a water and bleach mixture (1:4 ratio for Sunbrella®) can be applied directly to the stain.
- Allow it to sit for a few minutes before scrubbing and rinsing thoroughly.

Storage:

1. When your curtains are not in use, store them in a cool, dry place.
2. Avoid long-term folding or creasing to prevent damage to the fabric.

Additional Tips:

- Do not iron, dry clean, or use harsh chemicals on your outdoor curtains. (Trust Badges Below)
- Avoid abrasive cleaning tools that can damage the fabric.
- Sunbrella fabric is inherently resistant to stains due to its solution-dyed acrylic fibers.
